### STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Methodist School for Early Education seeks to nurture in young people a solid base upon which their faith can grow and mature. We affirm that an important part of our responsibility is to direct young children toward a life in Jesus Christ. We believe that as children relate to the natural world they are ready to respond to the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, we provide a curriculum that integrates Christian education with the development of appropriate social and academic skills. With the aid of Christian teachers in a Christian environment, these goals will be realized.

## Children and Discipline

We are committed to the belief that children learn best in an atmosphere which values and respects the uniqueness of each individual child. We believe that an important part of our teaching task involves helping children develop an inner discipline. This means we must provide reasonable rules, logical consequences for breaking those rules, and be willing to give more personal responsibility to the children as they are able to assume it.

In this program we utilize positive techniques of guidance, including redirection, anticipation and elimination of potential problems, positive reinforcement, and encouragement. As the circumstances may require, we will use supervised time apart from the group. Consistent, clear rules and daily routines are established and we stress the importance that they be followed by everyone.

In the event of any persisting problem with your child, we will work closely with you so that together with our mutual understanding and reinforcement we can direct a behavioral pattern. If a child has continual difficulty controlling behavior to the extent that there is continual disruption to the class, making it impossible for others to have a successful school experience, a conference will be necessary to determine the continuation of the child in our program.

Remember that a crisis at home affects the child's behavior at school. Let us know the joyous happenings, the upsetting experiences, or important changes at home which may affect behavior. It is also important to let teachers know what a child has been told about an impending birth, serious illness, being adopted, or a recent death so any conversation can follow with complete empathy.

In all events, we like to consider this a joint venture with you in a mode of continuing development for your child.

### ALL PARENTS AND VISITORS MUST SIGN IN AT THE OFFICE

The Methodist School offers a wide variety of involvement opportunities for parents. You are encouraged to participate to a level that makes you comfortable. We offer the following opportunities for you to get involved:

**Volunteers**: All parents of <u>pre-k</u> and <u>older</u> are invited to help in the classroom (2 &3 year olds get upset when mommy or daddy come into the classroom before dismissal). Please sign up in the classroom at Parent Orientation. If you missed signing up, contact your child's teacher and ask to be placed on the schedule.

**PARENT'S COMMITTEE:** *Every* parent is a member of this committee by virtue of having a child enrolled in the school. We encourage you to participate in the Parent's Committee events, which include:

IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY (hurricane, tornado, etc.): We will follow Orange County Public Schools Emergency Plan on DAY ONE ONLY - after day one, please call the school office (407-644-4313) for a recorded message. If there is no message, we have no electrical power or we have sustained damage to our building & are unable to conduct classes. We also have plans for in-house emergencies. Emergency days will not be made up and no credit will be given for days missed.

**CLASSROOM CELEBRATIONS:** Birthdays may be celebrated in the classroom, but please **NO ELABORATE PARTIES!** Each teacher has something special planned for birthdays, but if you would like to send in snacks on that day, please contact your child's teacher. Decorated paper products are a nice way to make a birthday special. Summer birthdays are celebrated in May.

Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day, and Easter are <u>class</u> party days (St. Patrick's Day is optional). You may sign up at Parent Orientation to help on party day. **Young children are easily overwhelmed and we ask that party food and activities be kept simple. Please (if attending a party) spend the time with your child and make**

CONFERENCES AND PROGRESS REPORTS: During the school year, teachers will schedule a time to meet with you and update you on your child's progress in the classroom. For parents of 2 and 3 year olds and pre-kindergarten students, this meeting will be scheduled in January. Parents of kindergarten students will be asked to attend conferences in October and April to help monitor progress on a more detailed level. Teachers or parents can request a conference at any time during the year. Please contact the school director if you wish to do so. We are here for you and your child!

PHOTOS: Occasionally we have people from outside our school come in to video the children or take photos of them for various church related programs. The teachers also take photos in the classrooms & on the playground, they will sometimes post them online for you to view; A photo release form was included in your child's registration packet for you to give approval or decline..

FIELD TRIPS: Are for children in the pre-kindergarten and kindergarten classes only. A classroom representative will arrange drivers for each field trip. Each driver MUST SIGN IN at the school office before leaving for any trip. Please remember that teachers depend on their drivers to chaperone the children while on the field trip. As is mandatory with state laws, each child must have his/her own seat belt while riding in a volunteer driver's car.

**SNACK BASKET**: Each child will have a few opportunities to bring home the snack basket throughout the school year. Teachers will list the schedule on the monthly calendars. When your child brings home the basket, you are asked to return it filled with snacks for the upcoming school week. Crackers, cheese, fruit, pretzels, and popcorn are good choices. Snacks that coordinate with teaching units are great ideas! If you would like help with snack ideas, please consult your child's teacher, the newsletter, or the school office for help in choosing an appropriate snack. Please make certain you send enough snack for each child in the class (the teachers enjoy snacks, too!). Also, you might want to check with your child's teacher to find out about any **food allergies** the children might have. **Healthy snacks benefit all**! Please let your child assist in making the snack basket with you! If your child is ill during snack basket week, please do not worry! We always have extra items at school.......

**FOOD ALLERGY POLICY**: If a child has a food allergy, the parent/guardians must provide written notice to the Director, including documentation of the food allergy from the child's health care provider, instructions on precautions that need to be taken to avoid the allergic food and the health care providers order for medication., if any. MSEE will take the necessary precautions to keep the allergic foods away from the child and train staff on the proper management of the specific food allergy, including emergency procedures and how to administer medications.

SCHOOL BAGS: Each child will receive a tote bag that has been decorated by parent volunteers. If you would like to help decorate school bags, you may sign up at the Parent Orientation or contact your child's teacher. The school bags are the most important means of communication we have. All information coming from the school will be pinned on the outside of the bag. Any notes or fee payments from parents can be pinned on the bag and sent to school. Your child's teacher will check for incoming correspondence. It is your responsibility to check your child's bag each day, please! The safety pin should be kept pinned to the bag at all times. PLEASE MAKE CERTAIN

#### Morning drive thru ends at 9:05 a.m.

The Methodist School offers drive through drop off and pick up. The entrance for picking up/dropping off 3s and 2s is just past the church building on Morse Blvd. and is open during the above times. The Pre-kindergarten and Kindergarten pickup at NOON only is on Lincoln Avenue. Your child will be assigned a pick up number the first week of school. Please keep this number in your car and show it as you progress through the drive. This allows the teachers to easily identify you and bring your child to your car as promptly as possible. Please note that 10 minutes has been allowed for arrival and dismissal during which times staff members will escort your child to and from your car. Please DON'T GET OUT OF YOUR CAR in the drive through lane, wait for the teacher to bring your child to you. They will also put your child in their car seat or seat belt. PLEASE REFRAIN FROM USING YOUR CELL PHONE WHILE IN THE DRIVE THROUGH LANE for the safety of the children and staff, this will also allow you the time to greet your child. If you see that the car pool lane is full, please circle the block until you can safely enter. If you would like, you may escort your child to and from the classroom. We regret that we are unable to accommodate younger siblings in the classroom after 9:00 a.m. If you choose to walk your child into the school, please use available parking on Lincoln Ave. or the church parking lot on Interlachen Ave.

<u>Please do not arrive at school before 8:50 a.m.</u> (unless you have paid for early morning arrival) as our staff is busy preparing for your child's day. We appreciate your promptness in picking your child up from school **NO LATER THAN** the end of dismissal time. **YOU WILL BE CHARGED A LATE FEE** (minimum of \$10.00) BEGINNING 5 MINUTES AFTER THE HOUR. Please remember that our staff members have commitments of their own after dismissal.

As a safety precaution, children and parents are NOT ALLOWED to play on the playground while carpool is in progress.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION!!!!: Due to liability, CAR SEATS are the responsibility of the parents! Whether for carpooling or field trips!!! <u>Teachers and Assistants will no longer put car seats into cars.</u>

Tennis shoes are the BEST option for School. Flip-flops, sandals, cowboy boots, and especially CROCS are not safe for the playground!!!! Please honor this request.

#### **SCHOOL POLICIES**

All applicants <u>MUST</u> fulfill the following requirements (unless circumstances are changed by Director or the MSEE Board of Education):

#### Age Requirements:

1 day preschool child must be 2 years old by Dec. 31, 2017 2 day preschool child must be 2 years old by Sept. 1, 2017

3 year old preschool child must be 3 years old by Sept. 1, 2017 child must be 4 years old by Sept. 1, 2017 Kindergarten child must be 5 years old by Sept. 1, 2017

## The following information MUST be provided by the first day of school, children will NOT be allowed to attend class until proof of immunizations are on file:

- Medical Exam (form is available at your physician's office) attesting that the child is in good health or that any known medical conditions or health problem are under control
- Florida Proof of Immunizations (obtained through your physician's office) appropriate to the child's age or indication that immunizations are being brought up to date
- Notarized Medical Release Form
- Child Record Form (obtained in the school office)
- Child and Discipline Form (also obtained in the school office)

#### PLEASE NOTE:

The school reserves the right to turn away any child who is judged by the teacher or director to present a health hazard to the class. Please notify the school if your child develops a communicable disease. If a child becomes ill during school hours, the child will be separated from the other children while we make every effort to contact a parent and await pickup of the sick child. Children should remain home for at least 24 hours after vomiting has ceased or after fever has abated. Children must have been on an antibiotic for 48 hours before returning to school. Prescription medicines and over the counter medicines cannot be dispensed at school (unless in an emergency situation: Epipen, etc.). Authorization forms must be completed for all prescriptions.

If your child needs to leave our school for medical or enrichment purposes during school hours, it is the responsibility of the parents to see that the child is placed on Orange County School bus or other means of transportation.

The Board of the Methodist School for Early Education is comprised of the Director, the Children's Ministries Director, and representatives from church committees. It is the responsibility of the Board to oversee and address administrative issues.

The School is accredited by the United Methodist Association of Preschools (UMAP) yearly. We are licensed by the Florida Department of Children and Families (#C09OR0155), and members of

**Music** is taught by Mary Elizabeth Langston. This time provides an opportunity for children to hear music and use their voices, bodies, and even instruments in activities designed specifically for young children.

#### Registration:

There is a \$80.00 NON-REFUNDABLE/NON-TRANSFERABLE registration fee (per child), which is due when you register your child.

#### Material Fee:

This **NON-REFUNDABLE/NON TRANSFERABLE** fee is **due when you register** your child. These fees are used to purchase educational and consumable supplies, and to <u>HELP</u> cover the cost of field trips when applicable (pre k and kindergarten classes).

#### **Tuition:**

Tuition is based on a ten month calendar, beginning in August and ending in May. TUITION IS AN ANNUAL FEE which can be divided, for your convenience, into 10 equal installments. Tuition is payable on an annual, semi-annual, or monthly basis. Full year tuition installments are due August 1st, semi-annual installments are due August 1st and January 1st, and monthly installments are due the first day of each month. We offer the convenience of TUITION EXPRESS, an automated payment processing system that allows you to pay online, or thru automated deductions through your credit card, or checking account. There is a \$20.00 late fee charged for tuition installments received in the office after the 10th of each month. A WRITTEN two-week notice to the school office is required when withdrawing your child from the program for any reason. You will be responsible for payment during this two-week period whether or not your child is in the classroom.
